

**RED HOOK TOWN BOARD SPECIAL WORKSHOP**  
**January 10, 2012**

A special workshop of the Town Board of the Town of Red Hook, Dutchess County, New York convened at Red Hook Town Hall, 7340 South Broadway, Red Hook at 7:00 p.m.

*Supervisor Crane* welcomed everyone to the workshop. She introduced Susan Ezrati, Chair of the Community Preservation Fund Committee, Art Collings, VP for Dutchess Land Conservancy, and Cari Watkins-Bates from Scenic Hudson.

*Susan Ezrati*, CPF Chair, explained the status of the plan. They looked at the open space plan's 220 parcels of agricultural land and detailed the attributes of each parcel. Each was rated and ranked in order of importance. She explained the ranking system and where the West Kerley Corners Road assemblage falls in that system. She referred to parcels along Pitcher Lane, Rockefeller Lane and Route 9G. That property did not have any associated land conservancy plans and the committee felt it was premature to consider that property at this time. The West Kerley Corners Road properties are a marvelous grouping because most of them are surrounded by farmland that is already protected. In addition it is a scenic road which is important in our conservation effort. For the purpose of Tivoli, the northern edge of the properties is wetland which feeds their aquifer.

*Supervisor Crane* thanked her and the committee for all the work they did on this. The CPF has been growing slowly and we have an amount of money set aside for community preservation. There is over \$710,000 in that fund. If we enter this, our share of the cost is 25%, not the typical 50%.

*Cari Watkins-Bates*, Scenic Hudson, gave a brief background of where they started until now. She pointed out properties on a map that are being considered on West Kerley Corners and Lasher Roads. New numbers have been provided regarding the estimates of the properties. She pointed out that no costs for a part of a property in Columbia County are included. Since the start, both the Bulkeley and Dee families donated conservation easements of nearly 150 acres along W. Kerley Corners Road which adds to the total acres being conserved. Regarding the timing, they applied in April 2011 and were awarded in August 2011. They are working as quickly as possible to close in the next few weeks. She thanked the CPF Committee for all their work.

*Art Collings*, Dutchess Land Conservancy, added that Dutchess Land Conservancy has committed to hold the conservation easements on the eight properties. In addition, during the course of the project they've had tremendous support. He also thanked the landowners.

*Susan Ezrati*, speaking as a Tivoli Village Trustee, said they passed a resolution on Monday night endorsing the use of the CPF money for the West Kerley Corners Road assemblage project. She said the Village of Red Hook also endorses the project.

*Supervisor Crane* asked for comments from the Board.

*Councilman Ross* is happy that it is finally coming to fruition.

*Councilwoman Cagle* said it is wonderful to see the CPF in action.

*Councilman Colgan* thanked Scenic Hudson, Dutchess Land Conservancy, and Rich Biezynski for all the work they've done. It's great to see it all worked out.

*Councilman O'Neill* thinks it is a good and proper function for the Town to approve.

*Supervisor Crane* asked if anyone in the audience had a comment or question.

*Linda Keeling* is in favor of the proposal and asked how soon the money is distributed to those involved and asked how their money will be spent.

*Cari Watkins-Bates* anticipates that the money will come together soon. There are no strings attached to the funds. She did explain various ways property owners used their money.

*Attorney Chale* reviewed the package of prepared resolutions. She explained the process of the commitments for funding. Dutchess Land Conservancy will hold the perpetual conservation easements for the properties. There is a change from the commitment for Three Pond Farm because a portion of the parcel is in Columbia County which we are not paying for.

*Pete Hubbell, co-chair Ag. & Open Space Committee* asked if the Town is monitoring the relationship between the Town and the land trust.

*Attorney Chale* responded that we are. One document we are approving is the form of a monitoring agreement between the Town and Dutchess Land Conservancy. We are entering into the relationship with DLC with the expectation that they will carry out the monitoring responsibility and outline the monitoring agreement.

*Pete Hubbell* asked that the Ag. & Open Space Committee be notified and be given the opportunity to accompany the land trust when they do their monitoring.

*Attorney Chale* showed him an agreement.

*Pete Hubbell* wants to make sure that the Town is made aware of when the properties are going to be monitored. He doesn't want the Town to be left out of the process and wants to make sure the Red Hook Town monitoring team is part of that monitoring process.

*Attorney Chale* explained that we do not have a monitoring team at this point. In this set of projects we have an experienced conservancy that is willing to take on the monitoring.

*Supervisor Crane* assured Mr. Hubbell that we get a monitoring report annually which is there for review by the public. The special meeting concluded and the Town Board moved on to the regular Town Board agenda.

## **RED HOOK TOWN BOARD MEETING January 10, 2012**

Supervisor Crane opened the regular Town Board meeting at 7:40 p.m. She began with the Pledge of Allegiance.

### **SUPERVISOR'S REPORT**

The Supervisor's report dated December 31, 2012 was read as follows: Opening balance - \$3,796,149.02; Receipts - \$1,450,294.79; Disbursed - \$2,111,898.60; Balance - \$3,134,545.21. Supervisor Crane referred to the budget adjustments. She asked Business Manager Deborah Marks to present those.

Business Manager Deb Marks began with the General A Fund. Total offset to the fund balance is to appropriate the fund balance - \$10,897; General B Fund – Total offset to the fund balance is to reduce the appropriated fund balance - \$9,532; Highway DB Fund – Total offset to the fund balance is to reduce the appropriated fund balance - \$143.00; "Other Funds" Total offset to the fund balance is HA Capital PDR - \$1,016. Deb explained the reasons for each of the adjustments. She moved on to explain resolutions that need to be addressed. One is the resolution to acknowledge that the required audit of the Towns Justice Court was conducted. The other resolution is in regard to St. Margaret's. We want to close out special project, St. Margaret's. She would like to have that account be relieved of its liability to the General A Fund.

On a motion of Councilman Ross seconded by Councilman Colgan moved to accept the Supervisor's report with the budget adjustments.

### **TOWN CLERK'S REPORT**

Supervisor Crane said the Community Development Block Grant program is holding public hearings at various locations to poll communities as to what they feel the CDBG priorities should be. This will set the categories for allocations for the next five years. Councilman Ross wants to encourage them to put recreation as a priority in the five year plan. The Board agrees with that idea.

Supervisor Crane thanked those involved in the PDR for those properties. 420 acres have been saved in the Town of Red Hook.

**CONSERVATION EASEMENT DISCUSSION**

Supervisor Crane explained that the Board previously discussed whether or not it was in the Town’s best interest to continue the term conservation easement program. She asked Councilman Colgan to lead the discussion and Councilman Ross to weigh in.

Councilman Colgan explained that three people signed up for this conservation easement. It seems that we can take easements in any case without having this term law. This term law has been misinterpreted a number of times and maybe we should end it.

Councilman Ross agreed that ending it makes the most sense to him. It hasn’t accomplished what they hoped.

Supervisor Crane said it was established by local law so to abolish it there would have to be another local law. In order to do that there has to be a public hearing. She suggested setting a date for that public hearing.

Attorney Chale explained the procedure. She suggested setting a date for February and she will prepare the paperwork

Supervisor Crane set the public hearing for February 14, 2012.

Councilman Colgan said we will have to honor those agreements that are in existence.

Councilman Ross agreed that is what they discussed.

Councilwoman Cagle asked when the Town Board members will discuss the issue.

Supervisor Crane told her it would be discussed at the January 25, 2012 meeting.

**ASSOCIATION OF TOWNS ANNOUNCEMENT**

Supervisor Crane received a request from the Association of Towns to read their material at the first meeting of the year. The Town Board voted not to allocate funding for anyone from the Town to attend. Attached resolutions will be passed to the Board to review.

**ANDERSON COMMONS NOVEMBER 11, 2011 CORRESPONDENCE**

Supervisor Crane explained the development project that came before the Board in 2005. There is a new owner before the Planning Board who is requesting a waiver from the application fee. The approvals for the fees all lapsed.

Councilman Ross asked what fees they are talking about. He doesn’t think they should be exempt from the fees but he feels it should be an expedited review since it already was reviewed.

Supervisor Crane referred to the fees and correspondence prepared by Planning Board Secretary Paula Schoonmaker. She feels it would be unwise to treat this differently from other applications in the past that have expired. She recommended not waiving any fees associated with the project.
